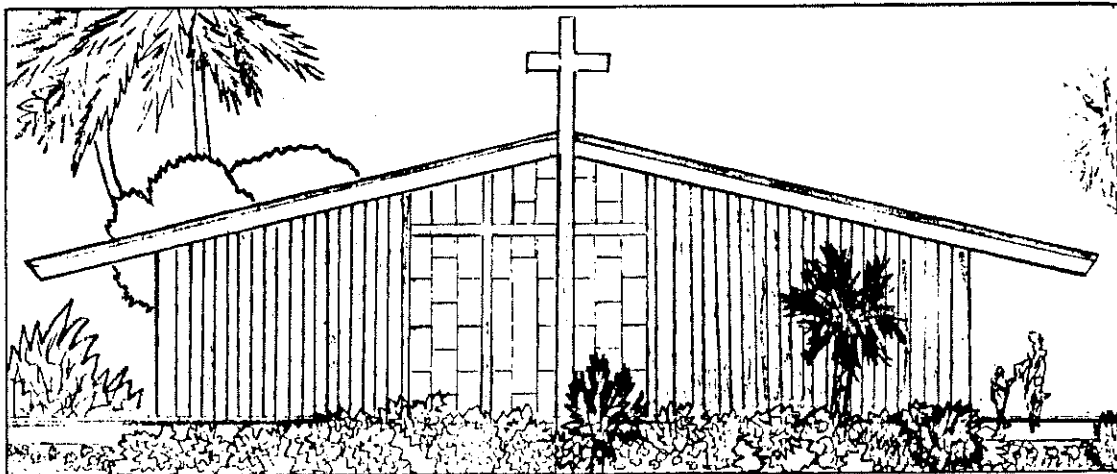

GROUND BREAKING

Sunday afternoon, Oct. 26, 1958 at 3 P.M. official ground breaking ceremonies for the starting of construction of the first unit of the Lakewood Methodist Church will be held on the Church site on Sandia Avenue between the Fairwood School and the corner of Oak Creek Way.

THE EXECUTIVE BOARD
