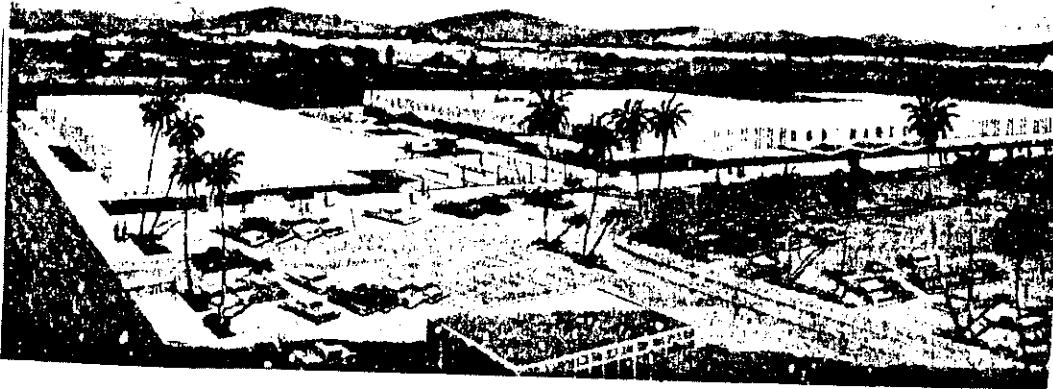


CITY TO HELP TEENAGERS



The above drawing is an artist's conception of the proposed and long awaited; \$1 million shopping center in Lakewood, planned under the ownership of Dick Yee Inc., of San Jose. In a recent interview, Mr. Yee said the construction would be done by Swenson Construction Co. of San Jose. There will be an estimated 200,000 square feet of covered floor space, with the supermarket planned as the main building, other stores to be constructed when tenants are available, (however I understood Mr. Yee to say that most of his tenant leases had already been signed.)

Construction is scheduled to start this month, (we were unable to get a definite date.) It had previously been planned to have the supermarket open for business by XMAS----- personally, we are keeping our fingers crossed! The proposed center is planned on the west side of Lawrence Sta. Road at Lakehaven Drive.
