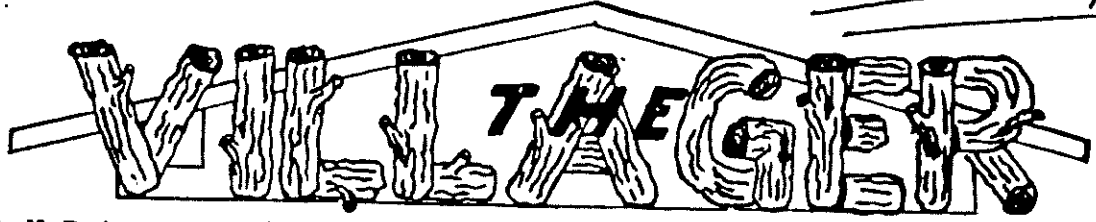

YULE LIGHTING CONTEST

The Sunnyvale Public Safety Department suggests you observe precaution in installing your lighting. Use only outdoor U.L. approved lighting equipment; as an added precaution Commander Riemer suggested that outside and inside spots be covered with a wire cage as insurance against small hands, pets' noses, and papers.

Entry in the LVRA Contest will not disqualify you from other Yule lighting contests.

RULES:

1. Contest is open to all residents living in LV except members of the Yule Lighting Committee.

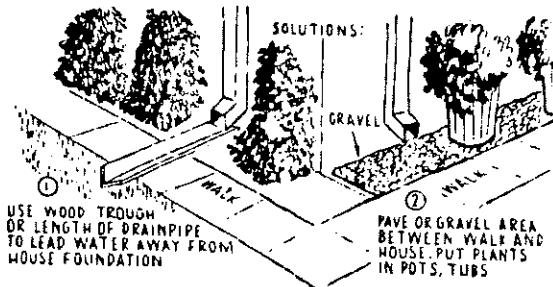

If you have never spent a rainy season in your new home, you can get a pretty good idea of potential drainage problems by letting the sprinkler run for a few hours on walks, driveway, patio, service area, and similar places. Watch how and where the water collects or drains away. If you have a Basil Flaw in slope or grade, you will want to know in time to do something about it. Be sure and check all down spouts, replace those concrete troughs provided with your house so the water drains away from the house. If you put in walks or flowerbeds, the illustration below may help solve



your problems. Check your ties and staked trees and plants. New trees and shrubs and roses can be planted bare-root from the nursery late this month or Jan. Biennials & Perennials such as Fox glove, Columbine, Sweet William, Primrose, Cyclamen can still be planted now.

ADVICE TO VANDALS
