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TAX INCREASE INFORMATION

Here are a few of the major items which should be known before you go to the polls on May 20th...the school tax increase is from the present rate of \$1.50 per \$100 assessed valuation to \$2.20...to those of you who are under the impression that taxes are paid on the real estate value of your home - rest assured this is not the case...the mean average of assessed valuation in Santa Clara County is \$3900 to \$4000 which would mean an increase of approximately \$27 per year here in Lakewood Village..even less if you have your Veteran's Tax Exemption..REMEMBER - the success of the forthcoming elementary school tax election is of vital importance to you parents of school age and pre-school age children!!
