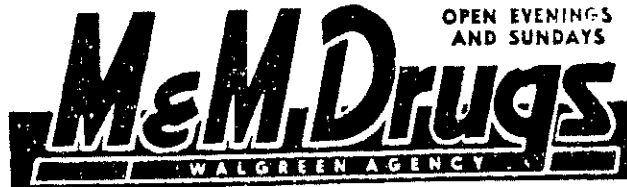

INSECT CONTROL

The Santa Clara County Health Department offers the following tips to reduce flies around your home:

Be sure your garbage can has a tight fitting lid and no holes. Wrap your garbage in newspapers or paper bags.

It helps to line the top of your container with newspapers to have an extra tight seal.

A few mothballs or similar products in your container will help repel flies.

Wash out garbage containers (the one in your house too) each time it is emptied.

Cover each new layer of material for your compost with a layer of dirt.

"Spade in" animal manure fertilizer in your garden.

Do not stack lawn clippings.

Immediately remove your pet's food when they are through.

GARBAGE INFORMATION

From the Santa Clara County Health Department.

Don't mix garbage with rubbish. Garbage is defined as waste matter from the kitchen. Rubbish is all other worthless matter.

The charge for garbage and rubbish service is based on 1 garbage container and 2 rubbish containers or bundles.

Containers should not be more than 32 gallons capacity. Tree and Shrub cuttings should be in bundles not over 4 feet long - boxes for rubbish should not exceed 12 cubic feet.

Containers should be placed at the curb the evening prior to pickup day and for appearance sake removed as soon as possible after they are emptied.
