L.V.R.A. ACTIVITY REPORT

On Tues., Jan. 20, your Chairman spoke at the City Council Meeting about some of the outstanding, undesirable conditions, including the unlighted Unit #4, the hazardous, inconvenient, unsightly unpaved street portions which have been even more so by even more inconvenient, unsightly and hazardous BARRICADES.

Mr. Burgess requested the City to take immediate steps to alleviate these temporary facilities. A report was expected two weeks following that date.

As a result of this request, Mr. Somers of the Public Works Department, reported by phone Jan. 23 on the action taken by his Dept. Mr. Somers said that "The City had not been aware of the fact that these situations existed and found, on investigation, that the lighting in Unit #4 had not passed inspection and, therefore, would require some alteration, plus the fact that a deposit had not been made. The deposit has now been made and the City has requisitioned PG&E to install the street lights. PG&E is expediting a RUSH order and this job to be accomplished in 2 to 3 weeks from this date." (We hope sooner.)

"Also the PG&E easement running through the center of our Village is to be cleaned out in the near future!" (Hurray! Let's keep it cleaned!)

"Reflectors will be placed on the Lakehaven Street barricade in the 800 block and 'NO PARKING' sign to be erected as a Temporary safety measure until the City can gain assessment of that portion of the street which is unpaved. This assessment must go through court procedure, which of course, takes time. But hope to fin-

ish paving that section of Lakehaven this year."

Note: This procedure should have been started and finished, long, long before now!

However, Mr. Somers made no mention in this report about the main issue - that is the complete and permanently built BARRICADE on Sandia at Lawrence Station Road (just 2 blocks down the street from the aforementioned barricade.) The latter barricading the main entrance to Fairwood-Lakewood Schools! So far, all we know about this is what we've read in the Standard to the affect that it was supposed to have been fixed temporarily, (Note: We are sorely tired of that word!) until Branden Construction lowers the grading of Lawrence Sta. Rd. as per former agreement. At this time, negotiations are being renewed towards this fulfillment; therefore, Sandia Ave. approach, as well as Lakehaven and Palamas Ave. approach- we hope can be tied in permanently as should be! Lawrence Sta. Road is to be built into a 4 lane road according to proposed plans. We whole heartedly support this plan.

GREEN THUMB

Be sure you water your plants under the eves of the house. Even tho it rains some of these plants won't get enough water.

For beautiful roses this spring and summer give your rose bushes attention NOW. Rose bushes should be planted now from bare root stock from your nurseryman. Fertilize old and new rose plants with steer manure. Be sure you prune bushes, not later than the last of Feb. If you want large blooms prune them heavy leaving two buds to a cane, prune out the old canes and leave the new ones only. Roses should be pruned less severely if you want MORE blooms.

You should start your Begonia bulbs Fairindoors now. Plant some Gladiola bulbs this month and some ever month till the first of July. Then they will bloom in your garden all summer.

Don't forget to put your fruit trees in at this time. You haven't much longer to get them bare root.



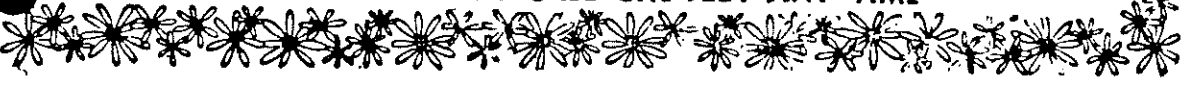
