

THE GREEN THUMB By Wayne Shoemaker

March is the month to put your lawn in shape for the spring and summer. Rake or curry your lawn heavy with a wire rake to remove all dead grass and debris. You people with 2 or 3 year old lawns may have to rake on mow it a couple times to get it clean. Then remove all weeds and foreign grasses, If there are to many to get by hand use a weed killer. Re-seed any bare spots that you may have at this time. Then fertilize your lawn with a liquid fertilizer, and repeat the fertilizing every 4 to 6 weeks all summer.

Now is the time to buy your camellias in the nursery, while they are in bloom.

A lot of your house plants should be repotted now. A good job for a rainy day.

Trim and thin out your flowering trees while they are in bloom. Use the flowers in the house.

Keep all plant beds watered underneath the eaves of the house.

BOARD OF EDUCATION: by Bob Sourer

At a regular meeting of the Sunnyvale Board of Education Thursday, February 19, bids were accepted for the construction of temporary, portable classrooms to be used as addition to the Fairwood, Morse, and San Miguel schools. Bidders were the Boyce Construction Co., Don Gordon, Oscar H. Liebert, Oscar W. Meyer, and the Leon M. Wheatley Corporation, who was assigned the project on a low bid of \$118,931 base bid. These portable classrooms should help alleviate the bulge at these schools.

The new Lakewood School was to have a preliminary inspection prior to final acceptance by the Dept. of Education on February 20th. The city expects to take possession on or about the 1st of March.

Also the board approved warrants for various expenditures totaling \$269,234. These two items total \$388,169, a sizeable sum for our city!

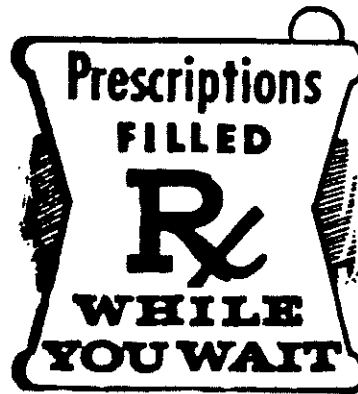
