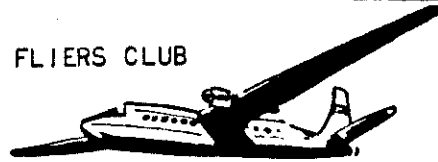

**IT'S THE LAW**



EXCERPTS FROM ORDINANCE NO. 258 PER-  
TAINING TO ANIMALS.

SECTION 8. ANIMALS TRESPASSING ON  
PRIVATE PROPERTY. ANY ANIMAL OR FOWL  
FOUND TRESPASSING UPON ANY PRIVATE  
PROPERTY IN THE CITY MAY BE TAKEN UP  
BY ANY PERSON AND COMMITTED TO THE  
CUSTODY OF THE MARSHAL; THE FEES PRE-  
SCRIBED HEREIN SHALL BE APPLICABLE  
AS IN OTHER CASES OF IMPOUNDING; AND  
IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL FOR THE OWNER  
OR KEEPER, AFTER RECEIVING WRITTEN  
NOTICE THAT AN ANIMAL OR FOWL IS  
TRESPASSING UPON ANY PRIVATE PROPER-  
TY, TO ALLOW SAID ANIMAL OR FOWL TO  
CONTINUE TO TRESPASS.

SECTION 39. UNLAWFUL TO ALLOW ANI-  
MALS TO RUN AT LARGE. NO OWNER OR  
PERSON HAVING CONTROL OF ANY ANIMAL  
MENTIONED IN THIS ORDINANCE.....,  
AND OF LICENSED DOGS, SHALL PERMIT  
THE ANIMALS, OR ANY OF THEM NOT MEN-  
TIONED IN SAID EXCEPTION, TO RUN AT  
LARGE.....
