WAITED ALONG THE 13 MILE ROUTE.

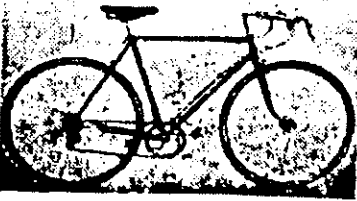

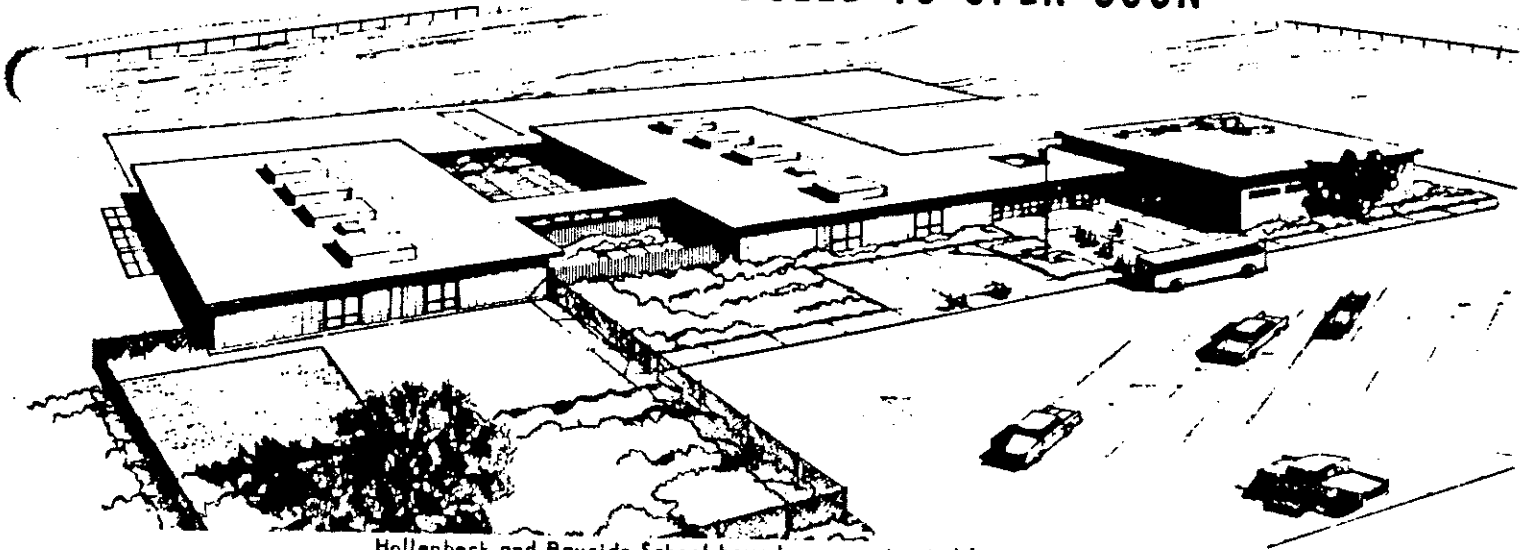

## TWIN SCHOOLS SCHEDULED TO OPEN SOON



Hollenbeck and Bayside School have been constructed from the same plans

Two new and identical elementary schools, in opposite ends of the Sunnyvale School District, soon will be added to the 15 school plants currently in operation. Bayside School is located on Hiddenlake Court and will serve pupils from Orchard Gardens and a portion of Lakewood Village. Hollenbeck School is at Hollenbeck and Quince Avenues slightly north of Fremont Road. It will serve pupils living in Fairbrae, Ancho Verde, and other areas on either side of Hollenbeck.

### State Aid Building Program Helps

The new plants, consisting of two kindergartens, twelve regular classrooms and auxiliary facilities, were designed by the architectural firm of Reid, Rockwell, Banwell and Tarics. John B. Sooy Construction Company is the general contractor on these two projects which will cost a total of slightly over one million dollars. Funds for these schools come under the State Aid Building Program and their construction was made possible by successful passage of the School Bond and State Aid elections of September 27, 1960. They represent the 12th and 13th schools constructed under this program since 1954. Additions to other schools have also been made under State Aid.

Every effort is being made to have classroom units ready as early as possible, with total completion scheduled for January. Because of fill and foundation requirements, Bayside construction will require about three weeks longer than its "sister" school.

### Classes & Faculties Already Organized

The Hollenbeck Principal is Dr. Wayne Herald who came to Sunnyvale from a principalship in Portland, Oregon this past September. Robert Goodrow, formerly Principal of Fair Oaks School, is the chief administrator at Bayside. Mr. Goodrow and Dr. Herald have been working with organized faculties and classes housed since September in other schools. The move into their own facilities will be accomplished without disruption.

The schools have colored concrete block construction with interior corridors serving the classroom wings. Roof lines extend beyond these wings to provide cover for adjacent kindergarten rooms and administrative quarters.

A feature of these new schools is the use of heat pumps for the threefold purpose of heating, ventilating and mechanical cooling. In addition to providing a desirable learning environment for the pupils, this system has made possible a compact and economical design for the total plant.

One classroom wing, adjacent to the library, has a room for the storage of audio-visual equipment and the other wing has similar storage for physical education equipment. Each wing also has a special room approximately 10' x 16' to accommodate small specialized instructional groups which are a part of the District's broad instructional program.

### Multi-Purpose Room Has New Features

The multi-purpose room which will seat over 300 for cafeteria purposes and over 400 for assembly use, has some features new in the Sunnyvale District. A combination stage and music room can be separated from the main area by folding doors to make most
