

## MINORITY ELECTS CITY COUNCIL

### SCHOOL BOARD REPORT

THE LAKEWOOD RESIDENTS THAT VOTED IN THE APRIL 16TH ELECTION OVERWHELMINGLY SUPPORTED THE TAX INCREASE AND SCHOOL BONDS. VILLAGE PRECINCTS AT FAIRWOOD AND LAKEWOOD SCHOOLS WERE AMONG THE FIRST REPORTING, AND ESTABLISHED THE TREND THAT THE REST OF SUNNYVALE FOLLOWED.

DR. MOLINO, SUPT. OF SCHOOLS, STATED THAT THE PASSAGE OF THE TWO FINANCIAL MEASURES ASSURES THE CONTINUANCE OF OUTSTANDING EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR THE CHILDREN OF SUNNYVALE.

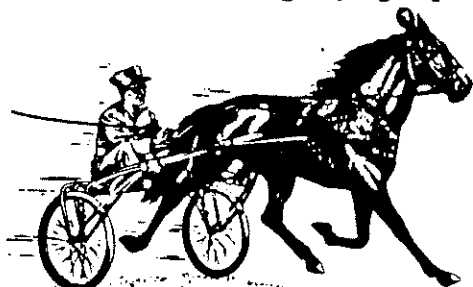
THE TAX INCREASE PASSED 1,957 TO 1,607; THE BONDS 2,468 TO 1,112; WITH A 27% TURNOUT OF REGISTERED VOTERS. THE VILLAGE SENT A DISAPPOINTING 20% OF ITS VOTERS TO THE POLLS BUT THOSE THAT VOTED, APPROVED BOTH MEASURES APPRECIABLY ABOVE THE CITY AVERAGE, E.G. A SCANT 53.6% OF THE REST OF THE CITY APPROVED THE TAX INCREASE, WHILE IN THE VILLAGE A RESOUNDING 70% VOTED YEA. THE BONDS, WHICH REQUIRED A 66 2/3% MAJORITY, SQUEAKED THROUGH WITH A CITY VOTE OF 67.5%, WHILE WE APPROVED HEARTILY WITH AN AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF 85%! AS ONE SCHOOL OFFICIAL PUT IT: "THE VILLAGE HAS ALWAYS HAD THE BEST AFFIRMATIVE PERCENTAGE OF ANY AREA IN THE CITY!"



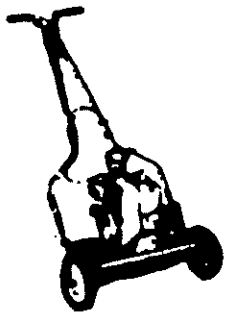
