TROOP AND PACK 403 NEWS

DURING THIS MONTH BOTH UNITS WILL BE RECHARTERING FOR THE YEAR MAY 1963 TO MAY 1964. IN ORDER TO DO THIS, A COMPLETE REVIEW OF THE PAST YEARS' EVENTS MUST BE MADE AS WELL AS A FORECAST FOR THE ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS FOR THE COMING YEAR. AS INSTITUTIONAL REPRESENTATIVE FOR THE UNITS, THIS BECOMES A VERY IMPORTANT TIME IN THAT IT IS THE PERIOD FOR REVIEWING THE MANY ASPECTS OF CUBBING AND SCOUTING, BOTH FROM THE STANDPOINT OF ACHIEVEMENTS AS WELL AS PROBLEMS.

IN REVIEWING THE PAST, IT SEEMS TO HAVE BEEN A GOOD YEAR...EXCEPT FOR ONE ITEM. THIS ONE ITEM, FROM OBSERVATION, IS AN OVERALL PROBLEM WHICH SEEMS TO BE NOT ONLY RESTRICTED TO SCOUTING, BUT TO SEVERAL OTHER ORGANIZATIONS SUCH AS THE P.T.A., AND HOME OWNERS ASSOCIATION. THIS PROBLEM IS HARD TO DEFINE AND ALMOST IMPOSSIBLE TO COPE WITH. IT CAN BE IDENTIFIED AS PARENTAL OR ADULT APATHY.

AT A RECENT UNIT MEETING OF ONE OF THE SCOUTING UNITS, A REQUEST WAS MADE FOR 3 VOLUNTEERS TO HANDLE THREE SEPERATE JOBS OVER THE NEXT YEAR, WHICH WOULD REQUIRE AT THE OUTSIDE, A MAXIMUM OF 12 HOURS A YEAR. (12 HOURS OUT OF 8,760 HOURS.) THE RESPONSE TO THIS REQUEST FOR A LITTLE HELP WAS COMPLETE AND TOTAL SILENCE. THIS REQUEST WAS MADE TO PEOPLE WHO SHOULD HAVE BEEN INTERESTED, AS THE PURPOSE WAS TO HELP THEIR CHILDREN WHO BELONG TO THIS UNIT AND WHO WOULD RECEIVE THE DIRECT BENEFIT OF THEIR HELP.

ALL OF THESE GROUPS NEED AND CAN USE HELP. HELP AND ASSISTANCE CAN COME IN MANY WAYS. ONE OF THE MAJOR WAYS TO HELP IS TO ATTEND THE MEETINGS OF THESE ORGANIZATIONS TO WHICH OUR CHILDREN OR OURSELVES BELONG. IF THE ONLY THING THAT WAS DONE WAS TO ATTEND, THE VERY LEAST WE WOULD ALL BE INFORMED AS TO WHAT OUR CHILDREN OR OURSELVES BELONGED TO. THIS MAY PROVE INTERESTING IN ITSELF. SOME OF THESE MEETINGS MAY PROVE TO BE INTERESTING, PARTICULARLY WHERE THE WEL-

FARE OF OUR CHILDREN IS CONCERNED. OF COURSE IF WE DON'T PARTICULARLY CARE ABOUT THE WELFARE OF OUR CHILDREN, THEN THE STATUS QUO CONDITION WHICH NOW EXISTS WILL REMAIN. YOU MAY BE SURPRISED TO LEARN THAT THE LEADERS OF THESE ORGANIZATIONS ARE REALLY PRETTY WONDERFUL PEOPLE, WHO ARE VERY SERIOUS ABOUT THEIR JOBS, AND THAT THEIR DEMANDS UPON YOUR TIME ARE MINIMUM. OF COURSE, THESE THINGS AND MANY MANY OTHER ITEMS ARE NEVER KNOWN BY MOST OF US BECAUSE WE DON'T CARE, LET ALONE PARTICIPATE.

WE ALL NEED HELP AT ONE TIME OR ANOTHER, SO WHY NOT ALL GET TOGETHER FOR COOPERATION AND HELP. AT THE NEXT P.T.A. MEETING, LET'S HELP. LET'S HELP AS PARENTS, AND FOR ONCE OUTNUMBER THE TEACHERS PRESENT AND SEE WHAT A P.T.A. MEETING IS. AT THE NEXT SCOUT OR CUB MEETING, LET'S HELP, NOT SHIRK. HELP BY BEING AN INTERESTED PARENT AND WANTING TO KNOW WHAT SCOUTING OR CUBBING IS. IN FACT THE NEXT TIME ANY ORGANIZATION TO WHICH WE BELONG HAS A MEETING, LET'S HELP BY JUST BEING THERE. 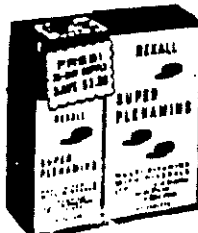

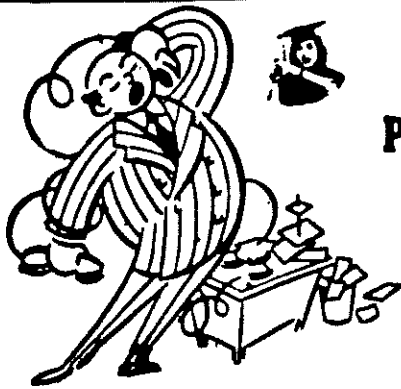

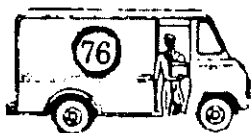
