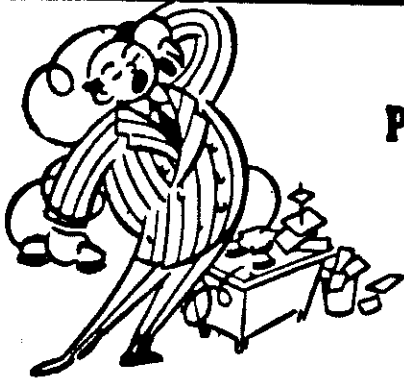

# PRESIDENT'S CORNER

UNFORTUNATELY THE VILLAGE AND THE RESIDENTS ASSOCIATION HAVE SUFFERED A TREMENDIOUS LOSS. THE SYLVESTERS HAVE MOVED TO SANTA CLARA, TO A NEW AND BEAUTIFUL HOME. WE ARE PROUD FOR BUCK, BEV AND FAMILY AND KNOW THAT THEY WILL BE MOST HAPPY IN THEIR NEW HOME, BUT WE WILL SORELY MISS THE HARD WORK AND SUPPORT OF THESE MOST WONDERFUL PEOPLE IN OUR VILLAGE AND ORGANIZATION. THE SYLVESTERS HAD RESIDED AT 834 LAKEMUIR DRIVE FOR THE PAST SIX YEARS. BUCK HAS SERVED AS UNIT REPRESENTATIVE, MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMAN, AND PRESIDENT OF THE L.V.R.A. WHILE BEVERLY WAS A MEMBER OF THE SOCIAL COMMITTEE FOR SEVERAL YEARS. OUR LOSS IS THE GAIN OF THE NORTH TRACT OF SANTA CLARA AND WE WISH THE SYLVESTER'S THE BEST OF HAPPINESS AND SUCCESS.

THE RESIDENTS ASSOCIATION RECENTLY APPEARED BEFORE THE CITY PLANNING COMMISSION AND VOICED OPPOSITION TO A TRALER PARK THAT IS BEING PLANNED ADJACENT TO LAKEWOOD VILLAGE. THE AREA THAT WOULD BE DEVELOPED INTO A TRAILER PARK IS BETWEEN FAIROAKS AND GREENLAKE DRIVE, AND WOULD ACCOMIDATE MANY TRAILERS. THE PARK WOULD BACK UP TO GREENLAKE DRIVE. WITH THE EXCEPTION OF APPROXIMATELY 140 FEET

WHICH WOULD CONTAIN A LARGE DRAINAGE DITCH. THE ASSOCIATION WAS OPPOSED BECAUSE IT WAS THE FEELING THAT PERMANENT STRUCTURES SHOULD BE BUILT ON THIS LAND. IT IS FELT THAT THE TRAILER PARK WILL TEND TO OVERLOAD OUR SCHOOLS AND MORE SCHOOL EXPANSION WILL BE NECESSARY. THE FEELING IS THAT TRAILER OWNERS PAY MUCH LESS TAXES THAN DO HOME OWNERS AND SHOULD THERE BE A RECESSION THE TRAILER DWELLERS WOULD MOVE OUT OF THE AREA AND AS A RESULT THE LOCAL HOMEOWNERS WOULD BE STUCK WITH THE NEW BUILDINGS AND AS A RESULT OF THE TAX REVENUE LOCAL TAXES WOULD BE INCREASED. LOCAL DEVELOPERS CLAIM THAT NO ROADS WOULD BE PUT THROUGH TO CONNECT TO VILLAGE STREETS AS THIS WOULD TURN MUCH INDUSTRIAL TRAFFIC THROUGH THE VILLAGE. THE BIG QUESTION OF THE ASSOCIATION WAS HOW THE CHIDDREN FROM THE TRAILER VILLAGE WOULD GET TO SCHOOL IF NO STREETS WERE PUT THROUGH. THESE AND MANY OTHER QUESTIONS CONFRONT THE ASSOCIATION WHICH DO NOT APPEAR TO ADD UP TO GOOD PLANNING. THE CITY STAFF HAS RECOMMENDED TO THE PLANNING COMMISSION APPROVAL OF THE PLANS. THE PLANNING COMMISSION HAS RECOMMENDED APPROVAL TO THE CITY COUNCIL. THE CITY COUNCIL WILL HOLD A PUBLIC HEARING ON THIS MATTER IN ABOUT TWO WEEKS. ALL THE RESIDENTS OF THE VILLAGE WHO ARE OPPOSED TO THE TRAILER COURT LOCATING IN THIS AREA SHOULD ATTEND THE CITY COUNCIL MEETING WHEN THIS MATTER COMES UP FOR DECISION AND VOICE THEIR OPINIONS. IF NOTHING ELSE, ATTEND AND LET THE CITY OFFICIALS KNOW THAT WE ARE INTERESTED IN OUR AREA.

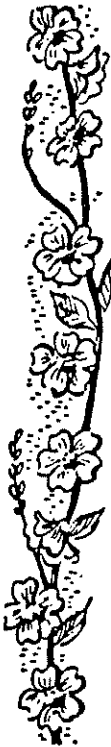

## Meat Balls in Tomato Sauce

1 pound ground beef  
1/2 pound ground lean pork  
1/2 clove garlic, minced  
1/2 teaspoon pepper  
1 egg  
1/2 cup water  
1/2 cup uncooked rice  
1 teaspoon salt

Have meat ground twice. Mix with remaining ingredients and form into 16 balls. Brown in a little hot fat in a skillet. In a large saucepan bring sauce ingredients to a boil, add balls, cover, turn down heat and simmer for 1 hour. *Sauce:* Mix together 2 cups canned tomatoes, 2 cups water, 1 medium onion, chopped, 1 teaspoon chili powder, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon sugar. Serves 4.

*Serve with:* green lima beans; buttered carrots; jellied fruit salad; canned date roll, vanilla sauce.

## Swedish Meat Balls

1 pound ground beef  
2 tablespoons finely chopped onion  
1 egg  
1/2 cup fine dry bread crumbs  
1/2 cup milk  
1 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon pepper  
1/2 teaspoon allspice  
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg  
1 teaspoon brown sugar  
Flour  
4 tablespoons fat  
1 cup milk, light cream or bouillon

Have the beef ground very fine (at least twice). Combine meat, onion, beaten egg, crumbs, milk, seasonings and sugar. Mix together thoroughly. Shape into balls 1 1/2 inches in diameter and roll in flour. Fry in melted fat over medium heat until well browned on all sides. Remove from frying pan. Add 1 cup milk, light cream or bouillon. Mix 2 tablespoons flour to a smooth paste with 1/2 cup water and add. stir until thickened. Season with 1 teaspoon salt and 1/2 teaspoon pepper. Add meat balls, cover and cook 20 minutes. Serves 4.

*Serve with:* boiled potatoes; stewed tomatoes; celery; ripe olives; cherry pie.

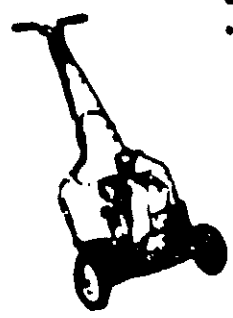

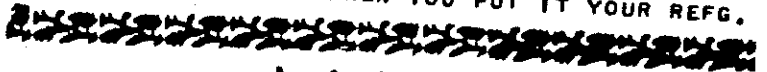
