

L.V.R.A. OFFICERS ELECTED

BRUCE GOSLOWSKY

AIRPOINT ON BALLOT

THE SANTA CLARA COUNTY CONFEDERATION OF HOMEOWNERS JOINED WITH MANY CIVIC MINDED GROUPS TO WAGE A STRONG FIGHT WITH OPPONENTS FOR THE PURCHASE OF THE AIRPOINT RESERVOIR SITE FOR A VALLEY FLOOR PARK. THE CONFEDERATION IS MADE UP OF MANY HOMEOWNER AND RESIDENT ASSOCIATIONS THROUGHOUT SANTA CLARA COUNTY.

THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA NOW OWNS THE 585 ACRES OF LAND NEAR MILPITAS AND HAD PLANNED TO BUILD A LARGE LAKE FOR THE STORAGE OF SOUTH BAY ACQUEDUCT WATER. AFTER MUCH STUDY IT WAS FOUND THAT IT WAS NOT FEASIBLE TO BUILD A LAKE AS THE SOIL FORMATION WOULD NOT HOLD A LARGE BODY OF WATER. THE STATE THEN OFFERED THE AREA FOR SALE TO THE COUNTY FOR A PARK. THE OFFERING PRICE WAS FOR LESS THAN THE STATE HAD PAID FOR IT AND INCLUDES THE SPRING VALLEY GOLF COURSE. THE STATE OFFER WAS GOOD ONLY UNTIL MARCH 10TH AT WHICH TIME IF THE COUNTY DID NOT BUY THE PROPERTY IT WOULD BE OFFERED TO PRIVATE PARTIES.

MANY SPECULATORS AND DEVELOPERS ARE INTERESTED IN THE LAND WHICH IS THE LAST REMAINING SITE IN THE AREA SUITABLE FOR A VALLEY FLOOR PARK. THOSE WISHING TO MAKE A FAST BUCK OPPOSED THE PURCHASE BY THE COUNTY. THE CONFEDERATION WROTE A LETTER TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS REQUESTING THAT THE COUNTY PURCHASE THE SITE. THEY WERE JOINED IN THEIR REQUEST BY THE CITIES OF SUNNYVALE, MILPITAS AND SANTA CLARA, MANY CIVIC GROUPS, THE COUNTY PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT, THE CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE AND THE TERRA CLUB WERE AMONG THOSE RECOMMENDING THE PURCHASE. CORNER

A MOTION HAS BEEN MADE AND SECONDED TO MAKE AN AMENDMENT TO THE BYLAWS OF THE ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE LAKEWOOD VILLAGE RESIDENTS' ASSOCIATION.
ARTICLE FOUR: DIRECTORS
"THE NUMBER OF DIRECTORS OF THE CORPORATION SHALL BE NOT LESS THAN ELEVEN NOR MORE THAN FOURTEEN"
THE MOTION MADE WHEN ACTED UPON WOULD INCREASE THE NUMBER OF DIRECTORS TO FIFTEEN. IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE TEN: BYLAW AMENDMENTS THIS NOTICE HAS BEEN DELIVERED TO ALL MEMBERS AND CAN BE ACTED UPON.

STANDING ALONE, FIGHTING FOR THE PURCHASE ON THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WAS MR. ED VIN. MR. LEVIN APPEARED BEFORE MANY GROUPS FOR THE CAUSE. HE WAS REARED IN THE SANTA CLARA VALLEY AND HAS WATCHED THE AREA MUSH-ROOM INTO A METROPOLITAN AREA. HE IS MOST AWARE OF THE GREAT POSSIBILITY THAT SOMEDAY THIS WILL BE AN AREA OF HIGH RISE APARTMENTS LIKE NEW YORK CITY. IF WE DO NOT SET ASIDE AND START DEVELOPING OUR PARKS NOW, WE WILL BE TOO LATE FOR THE AUSTERITY OF OUR CHILDREN AND GRANDCHILDREN.

DUE TO THE PRESSURE BROUGHT TO BEAR THE COUNTY SUPERVISORS FINALLY AGREED TO YIELD AND GIVE A HEARING TO THE MATTER. THE HOMEOWNERS CONFEDERATION WAS ONE OF THE LEADERS IN PRESENTING THE REQUEST FOR PURCHASE. MOST SUPERVISORS HAD ALREADY REACHED THEIR DECISIONS BEFORE THE HEARING AND HAD LENGTHY REASONS WHY THEY WERE OPPOSED TO THE PURCHASE. WHEN THE DUST HAD SETTLED THE VOTE WAS 3 TO 2 AGAINST THE PURCHASE. THIS WAS OF NO SUPRISE AS THE SUPERVISORS HAD ALREADY MADE THEIR STAND KNOWN.

THE CONFEDERATION WAS NOT TO BE DENIED AND MOVED TO REQUEST THE STATE FOR AN EXTENTION OF THE TIME LIMIT AND TO ATTEMPT TO GET THE MATTER PLACED ON THE JUNE BALLOT TO LET THE VOTERS DECIDE.

THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS SAW THE HAND-WRITING ON THE WALL AND ON MARCH 9TH REVERSED THEIR PREVIOUS DECISION BY AGREEING TO PLACE THE ISSUE ON THE JUNE BALLOT. THEY ALSO CONTACTED THE STATE AND RECEIVED AN EXTENSION ON THE TIME LIMIT FOR THE PURCHASE.

NOW THE MATTER WILL BE LEFT IN THE HANDS OF THE VOTERS TO MAKE THE DECISION. EVERYBODY WHO OWNS A PIECE OF WORTHLESS MOUNTAIN PROPERTY WILL BE LOBBYING AGAINST THE AIRPOINT SITE PURCHASE IN THE HOPES THAT THEY CAN SELLS THEIRS TO THE COUNTY. YOUR ASSOCIATIONS NEED YOUR VOTE TO HELP BUY THIS PARK SITE.

Pair Scalded

STANFORD—Two men were in serious condition at Palo Alto-Stanford hospital Wednesday with severe steam burns suffered when a gasket broke on a steam line they were repairing on the campus.

FOR 32 YEAR OLD, LAKEWOOD VILLAGER, GENE HENTHORN THIS WAS THE BEGINING OF A STUDY IN FAITH AND COURAGE. SUFFERING SECOND DEGREE BURNS ON HIS HEAD AND UPPER PARTS OF HIS BODY, IT WAS UNKNOWN AT THAT TIME IF HIS EYES, WHICH WERE ALSO BURNED, AND HIS HEARING WOULD BE PERMANENTLY IMPAIRED OR HOW MUCH DAMAGE HAD BEEN DONE TO HIS SKIN.

TODAY, ALMOST THREE WEEKS LATER, WITH INFECTION PRESENTING SUCH A GREAT RISK, MR. HENTHORN IS STILL IN ISOLATION AND UNDER 24 HOUR NURSING CARE. VISITED DAILY BY HIS WIFE, CLAYRE, SHE IS THE ONLY PERSON ALLOWED TO SEE HIM. THE FINE TEAM OF SPECIALISTS AT PALO ALTO-STANFORD HOSPITAL FIND HIS PROGRESS SATISFACTORY. MOST AMAZING IS THE FACT THAT HIS HEALING HAS BEEN SO EXTRA-ORDINARY AS NOT TO REQUIRE PLASTIC SURGERY OR SKIN GRAFTING. HIS SIGHT, THOUGH STILL HAZY DOES NOT INDICATE PERMANENT DAMAGE. HIS RIGHT EAR IS SEVERELY INFECTED AND YET HE CAN HEAR.

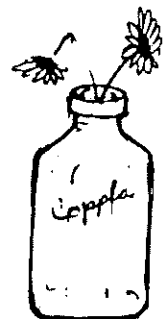

DISSOLVE ONE PART OF SODIUM CITRATE IN SIX PARTS OF WATER AND ADD SIX PARTS OF COMMERCIAL GLYCERIN. TO THIS MIXTURE ADD ENOUGH POWERED WHITING TO FORM A THICK PASTE.

WHITING IS AVAILABLE IN MOST PAINT AND HARDWARE STORES, THE OTHER ITEMS CAN BE BOUGHT IN A DRUGSTORE. SPREAD A THICK COAT OF THE PASTE OVER THE STAIN AND KEEP IT ON FOR ABOUT A WEEK. AS EACH APPLICATION BECOMES DRY ADD NEW PASTE OVER THE OLD TO KEEP THE THICK PASTE MOIST AT ALL TIMES. AFTER THE LAST APPLICATION HAS BEEN REMOVED, DO NOT ALLOW IT TO DRY, CLEAN THE AREA WITH PLENTY OF WATER.

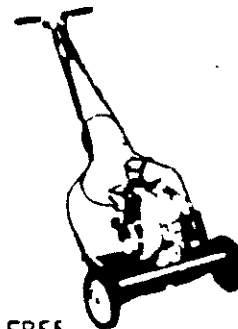

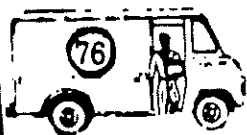
