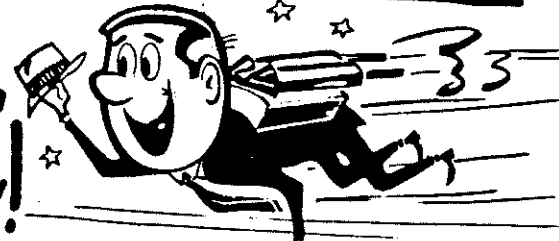

MAY IS THE TIME FOR PLANTING YOUR SUMMER GARDENS, IF YOU HAVEN'T ALREADY. I'VE GOTTEN ONE CROP OF RADISHES, AND MY LETTUCE IS ALMOST READY TO PICK. DON'T ATTEMPT TO RAISE ANYTHING THAT WILL REQUIRE A LOT OF HEAT: LIKE MELONS, AS THIS REGION HAS TOO MANY FOGGY MORNINGS.

CONTINUE YOUR SUMMER ANNUALS PLANTING (NURSERY-STARTED IS BEST), AND TREES IN CONTAINERS. SUMMER ANNUALS AND PERENNIALS STARTED FROM SEED IS BEST RAISED IN FLATS FOR BETTER WATERING, FEEDING, AND WEED CONTROL. ALSO, FLATS ARE MOBILE FOR WINTER RAGE.

APHIS, SLUGS AND SNAILS ARE REALLY HEAVY THIS YEAR. EVERY YEAR THERE ARE NEWER AND STRONGER CONTROLS FOR THESE PESTS. ASK YOUR LOCAL GARDEN CENTER CLERK ABOUT THEM, AND READ THE INSTRUCTIONS COMPLETELY BEFORE USING. ALSO DESCRIBE THE PLANTS YOU ARE HAVING PROBLEMS WITH, AS SOME CONTROLS WILL DO WELL ON CERTAIN TYPES AND KILL OTHERS.

START YOUR LAWN FERTILIZING AGAIN. EVERY 4 TO 6 WEEKS WILL KEEP IT IN PRETTY GOOD SHAPE. DON'T FORGET TO USE PLENTY OF WATER TO GET THE FERTILIZER DOWN INTO THE SOIL, BEFORE THE SUN STARTS BURNING THE GRASS.

SPECIAL: PRUNING CALENDAR FOR MAY.
CONIFERS (PINE, FIR, JUNIPER, ETC.):
NO PRUNING THROUGH JULY.

DECIDUOUS TREES (ANNUAL LEAF SHEDDERS):
LEAST POSSIBLE PRUNING.

EARLY FLOWERING DECIDUOUS PLANTS:
LEAST POSSIBLE PRUNING.

LATE FLOWERING DECIDUOUS PLANTS:
REMOVE SPENT BLOOMING BRANCHES IMMEDIATELY AFTER BLOOM.

HARDY BROADLEAF EVERGREENS (CITRUS TREES):
LEAST POSSIBLE PRUNING.

TROPICAL AND TENDER PLANTS: PRUNE NOW.

REMEMBER WHEN PRUNING, TO CUT AT A 45° ANGLE ABOUT 1/4 INCH ABOVE BUD UNION. USE ANVIL-TYPE SHEARS FOR LIGHT GARDEN WORK. LOPPING SHEARS ARE BEST USED FOR BRANCHES UP TO 1 INCH IN DIAMETER. PRUNING SAWS SHOULD BE USED FOR REMOVING THICK LIMBS. NEVER TWIST OR TURN WHILE CUTTING; BRUISES BRANCH, SPRINGS SHEARS. ALWAYS KEEP TOOLS SHARPENED.

THE GOLDEN EAGLES DRUM AND BELL CORPS FORMED BY MR. RICHARD THOMAS IN FEBRUARY 1963. THE CORPS AT THAT TIME CONSISTED OF 18 BOYS AND 6 GIRLS. THE GIRLS CARRIED BANNERS SPELLING EAGLES. MR. THOMAS WAS ASSISTED IN THE OPERATION OF THE CORPS BY GLENN HOGLEN AND RAYMOND JOHNSON, BOTH OF LAKEWOOD VILLAGE.

THE DRUMMERS AND BELL PLAYERS WERE INSTRUCTED BY LARRY THOMAS, 1961 JUNIOR STATE CHAMPION, INDIVIDUAL DRUMMING. TERRY THOMAS 1969 STATE CHAMPION DRUM MAJOR, WAS THE CORP MAJORETTE AND LEADER DURING PARADE AND FIELD COMPETITION.

THERE WERE VERY FEW OCCASIONS DURING THE SEASON WHEN THEY FAILED TO TAKE FIRST PLACE. IN SEPTEMBER 1963 THEY WON THE STATE CHAMPIONSHIP IN THE SENIOR DRUM CORPS DIVISION AT SANTA CLARA. GARY THOMAS TOOK FIRST PLACE IN THE JUNIOR INDIVIDUAL DRUMMING COMPETITION.

IN 1964, MR. THOMAS DECIDED TO ADD A COLOR GUARD TO SUPPLEMENT THE CORPS. BY ADDING TWO GIRLS TO THE SIX FLAG GIRLS USED PREVIOUS YEAR, THE COLOR GUARD WAS COMPOSED OF THE FOLLOWING:

TWO CAPTAINS
