# Something's Happened To Lakewood Village

SUNNYVALE — Lakewood Village, looked upon by many "that" side of town, is entering a new day.

Property is appreciating, pride is more evident in the care of homes and gardens, interest in local civic and social affairs is on the upswing, the district is located north of Bayshore Freeway.

Homes that sold originally for \$11,000 in 1953 are now selling for as much as \$23,500.

Real estate men who specialize in Lakewood homes say things are looking better all the time. "I've always felt there was nothing wrong with the area," realtor Bernice Elkins said.

John Pasley of Western Realty said contrary to popular opinion, it isn't hard to sell a Lakewood Village home. "Buyers cover the whole spectrum, too — investors, young couples, medical students, engineers."

Residents of Lakewood Village always have defended their neighborhood. And they have been sensitive to critical remarks. "We're just as good as anybody else," one resident said. The statement isn't new. But Steve Cooley, president of the Lakewood Village Residents Association indicates now people are beginning to believe what they have been saying all along.

"Just take a look at our area," he said. "It's on the improvement now. Sure, you can still tell where the renters are just from looking at the homes. But most people are taking better care of them, and there is a little more interest in the community."

But Lakewood Village still does not compare with the expensive neighborhoods on Sunnyvale's south side.

Economically, politically and geographically, Lakewood Village residents are separated from the rest of the city.

Only 27 per cent of Lakewood Village households earn \$10,000 or more per year. This compares with a city-wide figure of 43.2 per cent.

Sixty-nine per cent of Lakewood Village residents earn \$4,000 a year or more. But on a city-wide basis, 80 per cent of the people earn at least that much.

However, there are also fewer poor people living in Lakewood. Only 4.7 per cent earn \$4,000 or less. The city's average in this same category is 8.7 per cent.

These figures were developed from the latest census taken in 1965. Today, four years later, they are expected to be slightly different but nobody really knows how different.

Politically, Lakewood residents are far outstripped by the rest of the city in both terms of voting power and influence. There still is not one Lakewood Village resident on the City Council, Planning Commission, Parks and Recreation Commission, Library Board, Personnel Board, or Board of Building Code Appeals.

Recently there were six vacancies on these boards and commissions but councilmen appointed to one from Lakewood to fill them.

Ironically, Lakewood Village has had the only continuing homeowners association in the city — an association that didn't die out like others after a short time, or organize around one issue.

Geographically, Lakewood is separated by the physical barrier of Bayshore Freeway.

There is no public transportation connecting the "village" with the rest of the city, just an overpass. Those without cars find it dangerous to walk.

Families are younger in Lakewood Village and they have more children than families elsewhere in the city. The average Lakewood family has 4.5 persons compared to 3.4 persons in the rest of the city.

In the Lakewood neighborhood 49.3 per cent of the population is 29 years old or above. But 53.8 per cent are 29 or older in the rest of the city — so Lakewood has a younger population.

"People are people the whole world over," Mrs. Elkins said. "I don't think the people in Lakewood are any 'better' class now. They always were good people," she said.

Putting aside such opinions, the fact remains that the "people" today seem to be taking better care of their homes than some of the "people" several years ago.

This is largely due, realtors say, to economics. Cost of homes throughout Sunnyvale and the county are soaring. Lakewood Village homes are going up. But they are still cheaper.

They sold for \$11,000 in 1953. Today the range is \$19,750 to \$23,500. Payments run about \$182 a month. Pasley said. Because prices are up all over, the demand for moderate cost housing is great. That moderate cost home can be found in Lakewood Village.

"Lakewood homes have much to offer for the money," Mrs. Elkins said. But it still takes more money today and that means buyers have to earn more.

People with fair incomes are coming to Lakewood Village because they can find a good house at a price they can afford, she said. And because they are plowing more money into their investment, they take better care of it, she added.

"The idea they had years

ago that Lakewood Village was a lower income area is not true anymore. They have a good income just like anywhere else," Mrs. Elkins said.

Time was when some Lakewood streets looked like a depressed area.

Lawns were overrun with weeds, houses were badly in need of paint, big black oil marks blotted driveways and streets. Some homes still look like this.

This condition is largely attributed to the fact that many of the homes were scooped up by speculators who then turned around and rented them — milking the home for the money they could get out of them, and putting little cash into improvements.

In 1953 many, including servicemen, bought homes with a "very low down payment, or they went in on a GI loan. When they were transferred they were forced to sell quickly," Mrs. Elkins said.

Many of the homes were then bought with no down payment at all "and that's why the area wasn't taken care of."

Since then many homes have been resold several times. Property appreciates about 4 to 5 per cent a year just as it does in the rest of the city, Pasley said.

Cooley said some residents are conscious of property values. They are complaining that a proposed low and moderate cost housing development just north of Lakewood might lower value of their homes. Cooley disagrees. But the point is that residents are taking a real interest in their community.

About one-sixth of the 1,600 families in Lakewood are members of the Lakewood Village Residents Association and Cooley says that 20 to 25 persons usually show up for each meeting.

The turnout is considered good when you look at the dormant homeowners groups in the rest of the city. "Yes, I think we're entering a new day," Cooley said.

**DAY CARE**  
**STATE CHILDREN'S CENTER**  
at Lakewood School

A State Children's Center building is due to be built at Lakewood School within the next six weeks. The program is offered to eligible members of the community by Sunnyvale School District. The building will house fifty to sixty pre-school age children during the hours that their parents are employed. The Center will open at 6:45 in the morning and will not close until 6:00 in the evening.

The Center is available for children of low and middle income working parents. Single-parent families (divorced, widowed, servicemen's wives, etc.) are almost always eligible.

The program will be financed by monies from the State Children's Center Fund, and through parent fees. The fees are based on a sliding scale, according to ability to pay.

Sunnyvale School District has one operating Children's Center at Ellis School. The second Center at Lakewood School will have a similar program. Certified teachers and trained teacher aides provide an educational program. A hot lunch is included, as well as morning and afternoon snacks. Afternoon two hour naps are a regular part of the program.

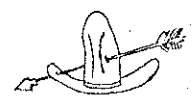
