## LVNA Meetings

### **September 8 General Meeting**

1. LVNA Annual Picnic preparation was finalized. Grant money will pay most of the cost. The volunteer DJ was confirmed, and volunteers were identified for cooking and cleanup.
2. City Councilman, and Lakewood Village resident Fred Fowler provided some insight on city issues and accepted some action items for presentation to the Sunnyvale City Council.
3. A parent noted that the parents of children who use the skate park in Lakewood Park should ensure that their children wear protective helmets.
4. Pest and rodent control was discussed. There is currently no active city program to mitigate what appears to be an increase of these varmints in our neighborhood. The LVNA Board will address this issue with City of Sunnyvale management.

### **September 30 Board Meeting**

1. The board discussed the lessons learned from the LVNA picnic.
2. We met Jake Rodriguez, the new member of the Neighborhood Preservation staff for Lakewood Village. Neighborhood Preservation Specialist Rich Gutierrez proposed the area for Phase 3 of the Neighborhood Enhancement Program.
3. We discussed pests, especially rodents, and wildlife problems. Some immediate efforts will be pursued, and we will work with the city to address the larger issue.
4. Discussed fund-raising and grant proposal ideas, and upcoming speakers and events. ■

## October in Your Yard and Garden

- Purchase spring bulbs for the best selection.
- Shop for native plants and set them in the garden.
- Purchase fall foliage plants in the nursery; the fall color of seed-grown plants varies greatly even in the same variety.
- Continue to weed. Add young, seedhead-free weeds and excess summer growth to the compost pile. Remember to keep the pile as damp as a wrung-out sponge for faster composting.
- Keep after the snails.
- Use a strong spray from the hose to wash away aphids.
- Water plants as needed.
- Stabilize plants that might be harmed by autumn wind.
- Water roses but withhold all fertilizer. When the ground freezes in colder areas, mulch the rose bed heavily.
- Continue to pinch off dead flowers. When frost comes to the garden, move fuchsias and begonias grown in pots to a sheltered, warmer location.
- Finish transplanting fall- and winter-flowering plants into the bedding plot. Soak all newly transplanted plants until the rains come.
- Harvest vegetables as they ripen. Plant the vegetable garden with cool-season crops such as beets, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, onions, parsnips, and turnips. If you put your vegetable garden to rest over the winter, cover it with manure so that the manure can decompose and age over the winter.
- Flush your watering system to remove mineral deposits.
- Rake up leaves. Continue to pull up dying annuals and vegetables. Add garden debris, except seed-bearing weeds and diseased plants, to the compost pile.
- Pick up fallen branches, pots, or other debris from the garden to reduce the number of over-wintering sites for snails, slugs, insects, and fungal spores. Continue to go through the garden and examine plants for black spots, bright orange rust pustules, white powdery mildew, rotted stems or branches, large, irregularly shaped galls near the soil, or other signs of infection. Pull up the infected plants and rake up infected leaves and dispose of them. Do not put infected material into the

compost bin. Bring a trash can with you into the garden so you can immediately dispose of infected material without spreading disease by dragging it through the garden.

- After cleaning up the garden, rinse gardening tools with a solution of one part bleach to three parts water. Then coat your tools lightly with oil to keep them from rusting.

*The following is a message from our principal, Sheri Holbrook:*

Our Board of Education has placed Measure P on the November ballot to repair schools in Sunnyvale. Sunnyvale's elementary and middle schools are 40 to 60 years old and are in need of repair.

At Lakewood School, Measure P will:

- Replace aging gas, water, and sewer lines
- Improve and expand school libraries
- Replace outdated heating and cooling equipment with energy-efficient systems
- Build permanent classroom facilities to replace selected portable classrooms
- Expand school facilities to relieve student overcrowding

Measure P funds will stay in our Sunnyvale schools to improve our aging neighborhood school facilities and cannot be taken away by the state. An independent citizens' oversight committee will ensure that all funds are spent responsibly and according to the voter-approved plan.

## Extra Curbside Garbage Pickup This Month

Additional curbside debris and garbage is picked up on your regular garbage collection day between October 4 and October 29. Put your items out by 6:00 a.m.. Call (408) 565-9900, x800 if you have any questions.

- Garbage cans, up to 32 gallons and 70 lbs.
- Trash bags, up to 32 gallons and 30 lbs.
- Refuse in cardboard boxes, up to 3'x2'x2' and 25 lbs.
- Cardboard, flattened and tied in bundles no larger than 30"x30"x6"
- Carpets or tree trimmings, tied in bundles no larger than 4' long and 1' diameter
- Small appliances; really small ones placed in boxes up to 70 lbs.
- Large appliances, with doors removed or securely taped closed; call 565-9900, x800.
- Household furniture and other large items, including lawnmowers (drained of fluids); call 565-9900, x800.

**NO** construction materials/debris, hazardous waste, TVs or computer monitors, tires or auto

parts, propane/fuel tanks, rocks / concrete / dirt / sod, tree stumps, sawdust or ashes (unless bagged), or business or commercial waste.

### Hazardous Waste Drop-off

Hazardous waste can be dropped off at the Sunnyvale SMaRT Station between 8:00 AM and 1:00 PM on Saturday, October 16.

### Other ways to dispose of your unwanted things:

- Consider selling your item on an online auction service like eBay (www.ebay.com), or use a consignment service like AuctionDrop (www.auctiondrop.com) to auction it for you. These are only two examples; there are many more choices.
- Donate it to a good cause. There are many charities that accept everything from cellphone batteries to salvageable building materials.
- Give it to someone you don't know. Try groups.yahoo.com/groups/freecyclesunnyvale for information about how to find someone in the Sunnyvale area who wants your junk. ■
