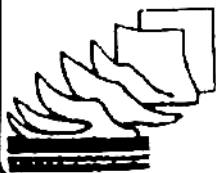

- 👉 Fire extinguishers
- 👉 Household & automotive cleaners
- 👉 Latex and oil-based paints and stains (paint that has been poured onto newspaper and dried is okay to dump)
- 👉 Flammable or combustible liquids
- 👉 Compressed gas cylinders
- 👉 Syringes (syringes may be placed in an approved sharps container or 2 liter bottle with cap so the contents are visible and must be taken directly to the SMaRT Station)

Call the non-emergency police phone number 730-7180 if you would like to report any activities from the NO column.

The tire dumpster will be located between the two gas stations in the parking lot of the Lakewood Village Shopping Center.

Hazardous Materials:

The hazardous materials listed above can be taken to the SMaRT Station on the same day as Dumpster Day, July 16, which is the hazardous-material collection day for July. (The SMaRT Station offers one hazardous-material collection day every month.) Placing these products in the garbage may cause harm to collection personnel and pollute the environment when sent to the landfill, so it is very important to dispose of these items properly.

Dumpster Day Sale

Items taken to the dumpsters but that are still in working or usable condition will be taken to the Dumpster Day Sale, in the Lakewood Village Shopping Center parking lot between the two gas stations. ■

July in Your Yard and Garden

- Weed. Do not let the weeds form seedheads.
- Add young, seedhead-free weeds to the compost pile. Remember to keep the pile as damp as a wrung-out sponge for faster composting.
- Watch out for snails and earwigs, both of which devour seedlings.
- Plant bulbs that bloom in autumn.
- Use a strong spray from the hose to wash away aphids.
- With fruit crops ripening this month, watch out for ants. Wrap fruit tree trunks with a sticky tape to control ants (wrap low so that birds, particularly hummingbirds, will not be attracted) and if necessary, spray.
- Water plants as needed.
- Insulate the garden soil from the hot, dry weather by applying a two-inch-thick mulch.
- Fertilize plants if you see signs of pale, lackluster growth. Fertilize the lawn. Fertilize all flowering plants that are about to bloom. Fertilize camellias. Fertilize roses, except most antique roses. In really hot areas, roses will probably stop flowering until the weather cools.
- Pinch off dead flowers. Make sure you get the entire flower head when deadheading annuals—particularly the swollen ovaries where seeds form.
- Transplant summer-flowering plants, such as cosmos, petunias, and zinnias that will endure heat, into the bedding plot. Hot weather is hard on newly transplanted plants. Shade them for a few days with the temporary shelter of an umbrella or wooden shake. Stake tall sprawling flowers such as dahlias.
- Continue to plant the vegetable garden. Thin vegetable seedlings that were sown too close together. Harvest vegetables as they ripen. Pick them early in the day.
- Soak all newly transplanted plants. Prune berry vines when you have finished harvesting.

No Hazwaste in the Dumpsters!

July 16 is the next Dumpster Day in Lakewood Village, but don't plan on putting paint, pesticides, solvents, batteries, fluorescent bulbs, or automotive fluids (oil, brake fluid) into the dumpster in your area. These items are hazardous waste, so they need to go to the Household Hazardous Waste Drop-Off Event Site near the SMaRT Station and Recycling Drop-Off Center off Caribbean Drive and Borregas Avenue (it's a short trip north on Lawrence Expressway to Caribbean and Borregas). The site will be open on July 16 to take these materials.

Donate Computer Monitors, TVs, and Laptop Computers

Plan ahead to get rid of televisions, computer monitors, and laptop computers. They *cannot* be put into your trash or into the dumpsters on Dumpster Day, but they *can* be donated to, for example, HOPE, which sells them to an authorized state recycler. You can take them to 1777 Agnew Road, Santa Clara, Monday through Thursday between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. A search on the Web will lead you to other recycling options. Sunnyvale residents can also take these items to the SMaRT Station 7 days a week between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. The SMaRT Station requires a special handling fee of \$15 for each item. Call (408) 730-7262 for more information. ■

June 9 General Meeting

Sunnyvale Department of Public Safety Chief Don Johnson briefed us on the department's role and responsibilities, as well as on issues pertaining specifically to Lakewood Village. He gave us handouts containing data on Sunnyvale crimes and traffic accidents. In the question-and-answer session that followed, Johnson told us that the department is trying to work on the county and city car-theft problem, among other problems, with a reduced budget. He encouraged interested people to become public safety volunteers. In response to questions about problems in Lakewood Village, Johnson said that if you want to report suspicious activity you should call (408) 730-7110 and give specific information, such as time of day of the activity, physical descriptions of people acting suspiciously, and license plate numbers. The drug hotline number is (408) 245-DRUG (3784). (See the back page of any issue of the Villager for phone numbers to call about other specific complaints.)

June 26 Board Meeting

The board did some further planning for Dumpster Day, to be held July 16. A Dumpster Day Sale will also be held, to raise funds for LVNA events such as the summer picnic and the holiday parade. Pocket Bikes and Powered Scooters — Safety First

The traffic and congested parking in the streets of Lakewood Village make riding pocket bikes (mini-motorcycles) and powered scooters hazardous, people at the June LVNA general meeting noted. You have to be a teenager to operate them, the Sunnyvale Department of Public Safety reminds parents.

The department gave us the following information about the use of pocket bikes and powered scooters:

- Pocket bike operators must have a valid license with a motorcycle endorsement, must wear a helmet, and must be at least 15-½ years old. The pocket bike must have all the standard safety features (lights, etc.) to be street approved.
- Powered scooters are not classified as motor vehicles, so no license is required, but the operator must wear a helmet and be at least 16 years old. If ridden on a street, the scooter must be ridden in the bike lane, or as close to the right-hand curb as possible.

Parents need to make sure that their teens operate pocket bikes and powered scooters safely—and that younger children not be permitted to use them.

If you see someone underage operating one of these vehicles or operating it unsafely or without required safety equipment, you can call 911 and request that an officer respond. ■


