




LVNA Summer Picnic: Save the Date & RSVP Now!

The safety of our community is a top priority, and the Lakewood Village Neighborhood Association (LVNA) is actively working to keep residents informed and engaged. This comes after a recent serious incident in our area and ongoing efforts to enhance neighborhood safety.

Recent Incident Near Fairwood Park

On **July 4, 2025, at approximately 9:45 p.m.**, Sunnyvale Department of Public Safety (DPS) officers responded to reports of two assaults with deadly weapons involving a knife and a handgun near the southeast side of Fairwood Park.

The incident occurred during a confrontation between two groups. One victim sustained a deep laceration from a knife, while another victim was pistol-whipped and suffered a gunshot wound to the wrist. Both victims were transported to Kaiser Santa Clara, with one later transferred to Valley Medical Center for trauma care. Despite their injuries, both victims were uncooperative with officers. The investigation is ongoing, and anyone with information is urged to call 408-730-7100.

LVNA Boards with Sunnyvale Police Leadership

In response to community safety concerns, Officer Joe Melo hosted a productive Zoom brainstorming session with the LVNA Board on July 24. The discussion focused on key issues such as traffic enforcement and reporting suspicious activity, emphasizing the importance of community involvement in finding solutions.

Building on these efforts, we are pleased to announce that Sunnyvale's new Police Chief, Daniel Pistor, will be our special guest at the upcoming LVNA General Meeting on Tuesday, October 8, at 7:00 PM.

Chief Pistor will discuss neighborhood safety priorities, answer your questions, and share his vision for community policing in Lakewood Village. This is a vital opportunity for residents to engage directly with law enforcement leadership, voice concerns, and offer suggestions.

Help Fix Lakewood Village! Report Issues Today

The LVNA board is working to compile a list of the most neglected areas in Lakewood Village, and we need your help! Our goal is to identify the **Top 10 Worst Spots** in the neighborhood and share them with the City of Sunnyvale to push for much-needed repairs and improvements.

What Issues Should You Report?

Look around Lakewood Village and let us know about areas that need attention, including but not limited to:

- Sidewalks that are cracked or unsafe
- Potholes that need filling
- Overgrown trees in need of trimming
- Abandoned vehicles that are taking up space
- Neglected properties that impact our community's appearance

How to Submit a Report

The more reports we get, the stronger our case! You can submit issues in two easy ways:

- 1. Email us with specific details (exact addresses, descriptions, and photos if possible) at board@lvnasv.org.
- 2. Report directly to the City via **Access Sunnyvale** (https://sunnyvale.dynamics365portals.us). This officially enters your complaint into the system. If you do this, let us know so we can help follow up!
- 3. Attend a City Hall meeting on a Tuesday to voice your concerns in person—this can make an even bigger impact and catch their attention. If you choose this option, also file a claim on Access Sunnyvale to strengthen your case.
